We recognize reasonable minds disagree. If the proponents of abolishing ICE desire a constructive conversation that includes practical solutions to fix our immigration system, the ASA is all ears. Our deputies routinely witness the impact of our broken immigration system. We may not always agree on solutions but we always listen as public servants. Make no mistake though - the ASA will strongly oppose radical efforts calling for the abolition of an agency that's critical to America's public safety and national security. We thank the officers serving ICE for their service. The ASA remains open to considering clear-headed policy solutions on immigration that strengthen our communities and keep our citizens and residents safe. Our constituents, the voters, expect nothing less from us.
