PROPOSED TRAINING SCHEDULE

Day 1 Review of student's individual equipment, as well as any assigned team gear to ensure all gear is in good working order. Rapid dress drills will be incorporated throughout the week to aid in team building and develop efficiency in preparing for emergency operations. Assignment of Team Leaders, and this position will be rotated through by each student during the course of training. Students will review how to control a non-compliant subject utilizing body positioning, movement, momentum, and joint manipulation. The system is based on five Mechanical Advantage Control Holds (M.A.C.H.™) that use a subject's resistance against himself/herself. Emphasis in this course will be on MACH techniques best applied in DCT operations. Students will receive lecture and practical applications of DCT formations, Subject Apprehension Team (SAT) tactics, and Subject Control Restraints.

Day 2 Safety Brief and equipment check will be conducted by Team Leaders. Review of all Day 1 lessons. Rapid dress drills and rotation of Team Leaders will continue. Following of Day 1 review, Combined Team (DCT&SAT) will begin. Lectures and Practical Exercises will cover Response to large areas, linear and narrow areas, confined spaces and cell extractions. Day 2 reviews.

Day 3 Safety Brief and equipment check will be conducted by Team Leaders. Review of all Day 1 and Day 2 lessons will occur. Lecture and practical exercises will be given in Riot Control Agents, Less Lethal Munitions, and NFDDs. Medical considerations during operations will be trained, to include medical escort, medical support, and evacuation of injured personnel and prisoners. Day 3 will conclude with review.

Day 4 Safety Brief and equipment check will be conducted by Team Leaders. Review of all Day 1, Day 2, and Day 3 lessons will occur. Lecture and Practical exercises (if requested) for Breaching tools will be given. Day 4 will continue reinforcing team movement, formations, and responses to all areas.

Day 5 Safety Brief and equipment check will be conducted by Team Leaders. Review of all previous days of training lessons will occur. Students will execute four (4) Training DCT Operations Scenarios.

SPECIAL NOTE: All students should be prepared for a Training Emergency Recall during anytime following the completion of Day 1 training. This Scenario will be conducted at the discretion of the Instructor Cadre with approval and coordination of Training Staff. This drill proves extremely valuable in the development of Team cohesion, stress inoculation and critical thinking in stressful conditions.

Conclusion: The course will train students at the end user level for Disturbance Control Tactics, and Correctional Emergency Response Team operations, including team building and mindset. After satisfactory completion of this course, students will be certified as DCT/CERT End Users for a period of 2 years from completion for all skills and topics covered during the course.
